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TEA MARKET REPORT - Sale 01 held on Monday, 5th May, 2025

CTC LEAF: 17,964 packages of tea on offer met with a fairly strong demand.

BROKENS/FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring varieties were a strong feature of the sale and witnessed good competition and these could be quoted between Tk.270/- and Tk.300/-. Below best varieties were also a good market and witnessed some competition with prices ranging between Tk.245/- and Tk.265/-. The remainder met with a fair demand and these realised prices between Tk.215/- and Tk.230/-. BLF teas sold well and realised between Tk.160/- and Tk.209/-.

DUST: 3,101 packages of tea on offer met with good demand. Good liquoring Ds and CDs were very strongly competed for and mostly sold above valuations. PDs and RDs met with good demand and sold in line with quality with few withdrawals. BLF Dusts also sold well and prices

for these ranged between Tk.160/-and Tk.245/-. Loose tea buyers lent good support whilst Blenders were selective in their purchase.

COMMENTS: This was the first sale of the New Season 2025-2026 which met with a strong demand. Blenders lent fairly strong support along with Loose tea buyers who participated for all best varieties.

There was a fair weight of reprinted teas on offer from Season 2024-2025 which met with a restricted demand with heavy withdrawals.

CDs were a strong feature of the sale.



DEMAND: - Reduced Demand with an increase in offer of CTC leaf by approximately 0.6mkgs than last week. MARKET: - The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 73.82 (1157807.87kgs) of the total offering of 1568499.32Kgs. BEST:- Modest volume of best liquoring teas were on offer with demand continuing to persist from the local and regional buyers with prices fluctuating irregularly closely following quality. Local and Regional packagers continued to be fairly active. GOOD:- All sorts in this category met with selective demand and buyers were very price sensitive in this segment. Prices ruled irregular and lower with fair amount of teas remaining unsold due to lesser demand. There were no fanning grade on offer in this segment. Regional packagers, upcountry buyers were choosy and more price sensitive. BETTER MEDIUM & MEDIUM:- Prices for all categories continued to witness a downward trend of Rs 3 to 5 or more compared to the previous week. The were no price disparity among all sorts of the lower end of the better medium and the top end of the medium category teas. There was a slight better demand on the fanning grade in terms of sale however, the prices dropped by Rs 2 to 3 compared to last week. One of the major blenders improved their off take but were price sensitive whilst the other was fairly active. Western India regional Packeteers were selective. Very select buying was seen from the upcountry and local buyers. Exporters continued to be fairly active especially on cleaner, blacker fanning. However, on the larger broken only a select few exporters operated. PLAINERS:- Reduced demand but with prices declining in the range of Rs 4 to 6 with larger percentage of teas remaining unsold in this segment. Very few exporters were operating on the larger and select medium broken at easier prices. Major blenders were very choosy and internal buyers were selective along with the upcountry buyers. BUYING PATTERN: - The major blenders off take was 57.10% of the total CTC leaf sold.
